PREPPING FOR SUCCESS

After historic high water last year, we spent some of the winter and spring getting much our campus dry and ready for visitors this year. While much of this work fell outside of our capital campaign, thanks to generous donors and in-kind support, we were able to complete more of Phase I, get the property ready for the Maritime Heritage Center building construction, AND tackle some prep work for Phase II. We are ready to sprint to the finish line this year!

DEMO DAYS




Building demolition began September 10th and took 4 days to remove the structure. It would take only 1 week to completely clear the site!

STATE GRANT

The MMM is thrilled to announce that we have been awarded a \$500,000 capital project grant from the State of Michigan. This grant will go toward the Launching a Legacy campaign and help launch us into Phase II. Museum Executive Director Patti Montgomery Reinert commented by saying, "This grant will enable the Museum to enhance our ability to attract more tourists to South Haven and serve our community. We are grateful for the numerous supporters of the Museum and look forward to the completion of this project, so we can expand our educational and community service."

Senator Aric Nesbitt, a Member of the Senate Appropriations Committee and a longtime friend of the Museum, successfully helped secure this grant. Senator Nesbitt said, "The Michigan Maritime Museum is a treasure, their team is tremendous, and I am very grateful the Museum is in our community. Whether they are hosting community events, providing educational opportunities for students, or drawing more visitors to our area, the Michigan Maritime Museum is a blessing, and the capital project will be incredible."

COMMUNITY FOUNDATION GRANT



This summer, the South Haven Community Foundation (SHCF) launched a matching grant fundraising campaign to assist the Museum in reaching their financial goal and begin construction on their new Maritime Heritage Center building this fall. The SHCF agreed to match up to \$45,000 of community donations for a total of \$90,000. 
